# - Five things the church has to give that can reach people in our current culture

Our culture is changing, and changing very quickly. Things that were common only 20 years ago are disappearing or becoming unusual. Things that were rare 20 years ago are becoming commonplace. Disaster seems to strike nearly every day somewhere in America or in the world.

Our world is changing and it's not becoming more like Christ. The influence of the church is not as strong as it once was and our churches have largely abandoned their places in the community as centers for loving mission and ministry. We have retreated into ourselves and are focused on our own preferences, problems, provisions and properties.

But there's a real opportunity in this time to change all of that.

The church is still God's plan to reach humanity. At this moment we stand at a crossroads of opportunity. There are several possible paths to take. One way takes us down the same path most churches have been going down for the last 75 years. That path worked at some time in the past and can still feel comfortable, but it led to over 40 years of decline. Another possible path is the one that says, "Here we are! Come look at us!" - it's a path that expects people to come seek us out. The idea is that if you make your church interesting and attractive enough, seekers will come to look. That path actually still works to some extent, but with ever diminishing results. There are fewer and fewer people actively seeking and the ones who are, aren't looking in our direction.

Churches that cling to these two pathways are almost universally declining. Those that are growing are doing so almost entirely from transfer growth - from people coming from other churches. That's not the Biblical model for growth, nor is it effective in the long run. Churches that grow mainly from transfer growth are almost assured of moving into decline within 7 to 15 years.

However, there IS another path of opportunity. It's a path that is in line with what the early church did as it moved into the communities of that time and built relationships and cared for people. The early church existed in a culture that was opposed to its values and ideas. And yet it flourished in that environment! It did that by believers being loving toward one another, by being consistent in caring for the people in the wider community around them and by being willing to give of itself so that others could find hope.

Much like the church of that time, the church today has amazing things to offer to people in our communities. In particular, here are five things the church has to give that provide a real advantage in reaching our current changing culture:

An Experience of Connection and Community - The

Church provides real opportunities to have real connections with other people. When Christian community is in good working order, there's nothing like it. Genuine and true community is what people really want today.

Think about the rise of social media and online dating. It points out a desire in people to experience connection and community with other people. The millennial generation is focused on a sense of "togetherness". People love to talk about coming together to support a cause or raise awareness. As the church, we have to foster that. As Christians, we have to create an experience of community with both those inside and outside of God's reign.

To do that, we have to constantly build up our community together as believers - or else we'll have nothing to invite people into! But then we also have to actually <u>invite them</u> and make sure that the door is open to them and that they feel truly welcome.

An Opportunity for Transformative Growth - Transformation is such a huge word in the Christian context. It means that Jesus changes eternities and lives. Transformation creates excitement and can give the current generations the feeling of authenticity they desire. If what the church is doing doesn't change lives; doesn't change the world around us, it's easy to question the effectiveness of our message.

Think about Jesus' life. He transformed the lives of others and when he did, it brought validity to his message. We have to live out the same sort of transforming life as the church. Jesus was clear about this. It's certainly not Christ's fault when we don't do this... it's entirely ours. We have to provide our surrounding community and the world with a picture of what the real Gospel - the real Good News - looks like and help people as they go through life's challenges.

A Lifestyle of Meaningful and Significant Action - People are feeling powerless in the face of sweeping events, self-serving politics and shifting attitudes. They want to feel like they can make a difference; make some sort of impact on the world. They want to feel like they can accomplish something meaningful on a regular basis.

That's the specialty of the church!

When we have ministries that accomplish things - right out in the open, in plain view - people are inspired! When obviously ordinary people accomplish something without having to be big-time, noisy politicians or celebrities, or having to employ huge amounts of resources, they realize that they could accomplish things along with us.

A Feeling of Continuity Between Ancient and Contemporary - There's a desire in the current millennial generation for some of the tradition of the past. But they're not looking for a static worship of past practices, they're looking for a connection with ancient reality; a sense of place in history; a feeling of connection and continuity with people of centuries ago. Not that they want dry history lessons or practices that are kept "because we've always done it that

way." They want a blending of the ages where they can develop a feeling of how we fit into the broad scope of history.

They're not interested in some idealized time period in the past. They're certainly not looking for nostalgia about how churches were 25, 50, 75 years ago, but there's some real desire for the whole scope of tradition of the centuries of the church.

A Sense of Genuine Hope - As the world continues to undergo change and we see so much of what we used to take for granted fall away; as we are bombarded by images of violence; as the news continues to cover more tragedy and disaster, people desire something to encourage them and their families and give them hope.

True hope is only available through Jesus. I'm afraid that many local churches hide this hope behind personal agendas and political statements. We're called to offer hope to others by lifting up the Hope of the World! And we have to do this by giving them examples of what it really means to live out that hope in the real world as believers.

We stand at a crossroads. What we choose to be and choose to do as a church can make a real difference in our lives, in the lives of people we meet, in our community and in the world. Pray for our church and for the people of our community as we move toward a time of new growth at EUMC!

# **Easter Sunday we'll begin a new message series** - It's Never Too Late in Life!

In life we sometimes miss opportunities and those opportunities may never come around again. As we grow up,

some of the hopes and dreams we have as children fade and we find ourselves with fewer and fewer options about what we will accomplish in life. So sometimes we begin to feel like we've missed our opportunity; like life and potential fulfillment have passed us by. In reality, it's never too late with God. In this series we'll look at what God can do no matter how late it seems.

# March 27 - Easter Sunday - Part 1: Making a New Start in Life!

Fresh starts aren't limited to any type of people or group. They can be physical, emotional, mental, spiritual or political. When they are spiritual, though, it affects our emotional, mental, physical and political lives as well. For many believers their spiritual life has started to be like walking on a treadmill where you keep moving but you're not getting anywhere. You're a follower of Jesus but your relationship feels a little dry and you'd like something deeper and more meaningful. On the day we celebrate the ultimate fresh-start - the resurrection - this message is meant to help each of us get a new start in our relationship with God.

#### April 3 - Part 2: Turning Things Around in Life!

When circumstances aren't turning out like you want them to turn out, when things just aren't going like you want, you've got one of three choices. You can look down in discouragement or despair. You can look around for someone to blame. Or you can look up to God in hope. You could be facing the worst of circumstances but you don't have to live without hope for the rest of your life or even for a minute. In this message we'll explore how hope changes our lives and what to do when you don't know what to do.

#### April 10 - Part 3: Changing Experiences of Life!

Jesus was the greatest teacher ever. And he was a master storyteller. God knows how to change lives, influence, teach and inspire people and Jesus' primary way for doing that was telling stories. As human beings we are wired to respond to stories. God built you that way. In this message we'll talk about how each of us has a powerful story. You may not realize the influence of your story but you have a story to share and your story can be inspiring to people, simply because it's yours.

# April 17 - Part 4: Doing the Right Thing in Life!

The word "integrity" is an interesting word. It means to live an integrated life, a life that is whole, consistent, without compartmentalization of parts of your life. Integrity is first and foremost an inside job - a matter of character. Character is something that is forged over time - you don't cram for it like a final exam - and it's something we have to come back to working on regularly. In this message we'll talk about the good news that it's never too late to work on it and it's never too late to do what's right.

### April 24 - Message: Part 5: Dealing with Endings in Life!

There are some times in life when things come to an end; times when a story ends or a job ends or a relationship ends or a life ends. What do we do when it seems like it really IS too late? How can we be prepared in life to deal with those times? In this message we'll look at what those times mean in our lives.

# One Family Together! It's Almost Time!

For two years we have worked on ideas for restructuring our Sunday schedule to make it more possible to gather and do things together - like



having luncheons after worship that are easy for all to attend. In addition, many people have been requesting that we have combined services MUCH more often.

In addition there was a growing call from people of both worship services to move to one united worship service that includes everyone of every age. So a study team was created, consisting of equal numbers of persons from each service and after much work and prayer that team brought a proposal to our Church Council and after much serious discussion and careful consideration the proposal was unanimously approved.

# As of April 3rd our new Sunday worship schedule will be as follows:

- 8:30 am **Devotional Worship Service** An informal 30-40 minute time of prayer, devotion, meditation and worship in the Chapel
- 9:15 am **Sunday School for All Ages** A variety of classes for every age and style
- 10:00 am **Fellowship Time** in the south end of the Chapel; An informal time to share, greet one another, get to know people better and enjoy being together
- 10:30 am Main Worship Service One United Worship Service in the Main Sanctuary; Includes musical leadership by both Kelly Saylor and Anita Focht and plans are to feature both a choir and a praise team

There are some changes that are being made to accommodate our new schedule and worship services. We will all need to be patient, caring for one another as many people work very hard to make this time of transition successful. Whatever you do, do it in love, accepting and caring for each person as we gather as one church family.

**Something Else to Look Forward to -** We also have a team working on a new, mid-week Prayer Service. That service will feature a variety of speaker/teachers, a simple format and a strong focus on prayer.

## **Prayer Alert Email System**

We have a great Prayer Alert Ministry in our church, where prayer requests are sent out by email to everyone who has a



published address in our printed church directory and, additionally, others who have asked to be on the contact list. This ministry is accomplished through caring people who work hard to make it happen.

But you should be aware that the Prayer Alert is a <u>volunteer ministry</u> created and run by members of our church. It is not controlled by or run through the church office or by any of our staff. The office and staff <u>do not</u> have any direct ability to send out these email alerts or to see any replies you might try to make. When you send a prayer to the office and specifically request that it be put on the prayer alert (you must request it - the office will not automatically do this), it is then forwarded to the prayer alert email address to be sent out.

But that's not the way it's supposed to work!

The way it's supposed to happen (and the fastest way) is for you to send the request yourself to the alert system by emailing them directly at **prayeralert@frontier.com** Going through the office delays the process. You should only send your request through the office if you do not have any access to email.

When your request is sent to the Prayer Alert Ministry, volunteers work to send out a notice as soon as possible. This system, however, was never designed to be a service where notices go out automatically or always go out immediately. Please remember that the Prayer Alert is a ministry of members who are volunteers. These are people who work and have other responsibilities. Generally prayer requests are sent out within 24 hours.

# A Few More Things to Remember:

Please remember that it is not possible to automatically include prayer requests that are offered verbally or on request cards. You must intentionally send any requests to the Prayer Alert Ministry.

Please do not send replies to the Prayer Alert requesting further information or addresses. This ministry simply passes along requests as appropriate. They do not have any files of information. For addresses, please refer to our printed church directory.

Please remember that you are NOT contacting the pastor, secretary, church office or other senders when you send anything or reply to anything on the Prayer Alert. Again, this is simply a system to relay prayer requests to those who have indicated that they would be willing to hold the requests up in prayer.
